in the forest sector



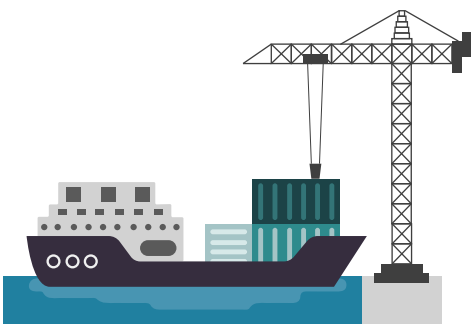
PROJECT OBJECTIVE

The project aims to strengthen national capacities and interagency coordination to effectively investigate and prosecute forest crime and the convergence of related serious crimes in Peru.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

- 01 **Capacity building programme** jointly designed with key national and regional authorities.
- 02 **Strengthened investigative capacities** to build and stimulate cases on illicit financial flows related to wildlife and forest crime.
- 03 **Strengthened coordination** and collaboration between justice and forest sector stakeholders.
- 04 **Increased awareness** on the best practices and tools to enhance law enforcement measures against forest crime.

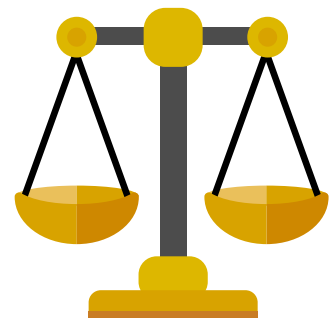
KEY FACTS
